Administrative Positions Held: Few More Details

A. Vice Chancellor, Kumaun University, Nainital: As Vice Chancellor of Kumaun University, I pioneered the use of information technology and the complete automation of the admission, examination, and accounting systems. In addition, all degrees were uploaded to the NAD, the university's syllabi were radically revised, and three new employment-oriented programmes, M. Sc. in Forensic Science, Diploma in Cyber-Security, and M. A. in Criminology, were introduced. I have also established the SRIC (Sponsored Research and Industrial Consultancy) Cell, the D & P (Development and Planning) Cell, the DIC (Digital Initiatives Cell), and the AAIC (Alumni Affairs and International Collaborations) Cell. The formation of these cells boosted Kumaun University's development and growth tremendously.

B. Dean, Students' Welfare, IIT Roorkee (May 2014-March 2017). I pioneered innovative initiatives such as the **Course Correction Approach**, which replaced the system of financial penalties/expulsion from the hostel/institute for acts of indiscipline, alcoholism, and drug abuse. One key aspect of this was the implementation of mandatory yoga lessons in the mornings from 6-7 a.m. or the completion of community service projects (if yoga is not preferred for religious and other reasons) for the defaulting

students. The IIT community was really appreciative of this. A thorough effort to modernise the students' mess facilities had also begun, dramatically improving the quality, service, and atmosphere of the students' mess services. Students' counselling services were restored, and a specific "Academic Reinforcement Program" for academically poorer students was implemented, with positive results.

C. Chairman, Hospital Advisory Committee, IIT Roorkee (Dec. 2007- Aug. 2012): During this tenure, the undersigned has taken bold initiatives in terms of gaps assessment and then accordingly mobilised resources and invested them to substantially upgrade the existing services and introduced new services. For services not offered by IIT Roorkee Hospital, big and credible hospitals in Delhi, Punjab, Karnataka, West Bengal, U. P., and at few other places were identified and then MOUs were signed up with them to offer such services to the patients referred by IIT Roorkee. IIT Roorkee Hospital was also modernized and transformed into a highly professional body in terms service offered and delivered.

D. Head, Dept. of Humanities & Social Sciences, IIT Roorkee for three years w.e.f. As Head of the Department of Humanities and Social Sciences at IIT Roorkee for three years, beginning on January 1, 2000, I introduced two new subjects, Philosophy and Sociology, while also enhancing the relevance of HSS disciplines in the overall engineering and science education curriculum. The Department organised the first international conference during this time period, which was presided over by His Holiness the Dalai Lama and attended by hundreds of delegates from India and throughout the world.

Dr. D. K. Nauriyal, Professor of Economics in the Department of Humanities & Social Sciences, has been working at IIT Roorkee since 1985. He started his career as a lecturer in HNB Garhwal University, Srinagar and after sometime joined erstwhile University of Roorkee, now IIT Roorkee. He has published over 50 research papers in National and International journals and conferences and supervised eight Ph.D. works and currently supervising six Ph. D. scholars. He has organized 14 short term programmes, 11 Executive Development programmes and conducted 21 consultancy projects. He has delivered expert lectures in different domains of Economics in the various universities and educational institutions across India.

Dr. Nauriyal has undertaken six major research projects awarded by The World Intellectual Property Organisation (Geneva), Ministry of Social Welfare (GOI), UGC, UNDP, and MORD (GOI). He is an active member of the Socio-Economic-Cultural (SEC) component of 'Ganga River basin Management Plan' being executed by the consortium of seven IITs. He had been Academic Advisor to Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) and Japan Bank for International Cooperation (JBIC) for one of the most ambitious projects of Indian Railways 'Dedicated Freight Corridor Project' supported BY JICA and JBC and Asian Development Bank.

Dr. Nauriyal is an academician more into interdisciplinary research as is suggested by his book co-edited with Michael Drummond and Y. B. Lal and entitled as 'Buddhist Thought and Applied Psychological Research: Transcending the Boundaries' published by Routledge (Taylor and Francis Group), London, Jan. 2006 simultaneously published in US and Canada as well. He has also written two well acclaimed papers on the subject of 'Emotional Intelligence'.

His efforts to combine his field-based and other research experience with the teaching have provided him the reputation of an excellent teacher among the student community. He has been Head of the Department of Humanities & Social Sciences since Jan. 1, 2000 till Dec. 31, 2002. He has also worked as Chairman, Hospital Advisory Committee since Dec. 1, 2007 till Aug. 16, 2012 and has not only brought out significant improvement in the health-care facilities for the Institute community but has also initiated capacity building of the Institute Hospital.
